

With a packed art calendar continuing into April 2021, here's the best of both physical and digital shows, across the country and beyond. It's an exciting time for the Indian contemporary art world, so get ready to discover your new favourites as young artists make their debut, even as the more established surprise you with the conscious directional changes in their works.

1. Take A Listen by Sheila Makhijani, Talwar Gallery, New York





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Sheila Makhijani whose art has been exhibited at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA), The Kiran Nadar Museum Of Art (KNMA), and The National Gallery Of Modern Art (NGMA), is back with an exhibition of new paintings and works on paper. With no negative space, her new canvases are packed with a vivid colour palette, even as she furthers her diaristic narrative.

this exhibit attempts to explore evolution, alongside the climate and ecological crises, but



About the exhibit, that sees Dayal's own works alongside various women artists, she says, "To be a woman is indeed a blessing and what better way than by rendering heartful brush strokes on canvas to convey what we feel."



8. Karkhana Chronicles, Soho House, Mumbai

A pop-up textile installation, Karkhana Chronicles brings together karigars and their custodians to celebrate Indian textiles and kickstart conversations about ethical fashion practices. The project is supported by several Indian Royal Families and the ReFashion Hub and aims to spearhead a conversation on reviving the know-how around heritage textiles, even as it advocates for a more conscious and sustainable fashion and textile industry.

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Sachin George Sebastian, solo exhibit will showcase new drawings and <u>cut-out sculptures</u>.

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



14. The Familiars, TARQ, Mumbai





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The artworks in this exhibition present the artist's introspection of her sense of drawing closer to the lives around her, drawing sustenance and inspiration from them to conjure new beings in the form of her woven canvases. For instance, she draws inspiration from her cats whose movements take on a metaphorical significance, much like they did for the French poet Charles Baudelaire, whose poem Le Chat, the artist quotes as inspiration.

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

"Around late 1966 after I returned from a three-year stay in England, I saw a vacancy advertised for the post of lecturer in art history at Chandigarh College of Art. Bhupen (Khakhar) and I decided to apply because I was unemployed and Bhupen was fed up with his job as an accountant. Neither of us expected to land the job (and neither of us did), but we were keen to see Corbusier's architecture, and also to relish the visual bonus of Chandigarh Museum's famed collection of miniature paintings. So off we went to Chandigarh. I carried my Asahi Pentax K2 (SLR) with 35mm black and white,
