2. The New Arabesque, Nature Morte, Delhi






6. Somethings are always burning, Chemould Prescott Road, Mumbai

The gallery is back after a 10 month renovation, once again to be an oasis of calm in the crazy that is Mumbai.

India's most infamous street artist Tyler finally graces a gallery wall and not city streets. The show is spread across two venues and invites everyone to interact with the artist's signature stencil art characters and situations that humorously reflects on varied political, social, gender and caste based structures.

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An exciting exhibition that builds on a story of artist friends Gulammohammed Sheikh and Nasreen Mohamedi-visiting Fatehpur Sikri in 1970, and almost five decades later a confabulation around that visit, which in turn led to misreadings, and misinterpretations. Gitanjali Dang, the curator brings together artworks by 27 artists for the exhibition. No small feat, that.

11. Portraits of the Self-II, Gallery Maskara, Mumbai

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

13. Oscillations, Blueprint12, Delhi

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




