

20 BEST ART GALLERIES IN MUMBAI YOU MUST VISIT

Mumbai is not only India's financial capital but also one of its most important cultural centers. The city has nurtured modernist pioneers such as M.F. Husain, Tyeb Mehta, S.H. Raza, and F.N. Souza while also supporting bold contemporary voices working with installations, photography, performance, and digital media.

From the heritage lanes of Kala Ghoda and Colaba to the creative neighborhoods of Worli and Bandra, these 20 art galleries in Mumbai highlight the city's vibrant and ever-evolving art culture.

1. Jehangir Art Gallery

Known for: Paintings, photography, sculptures, and rotating exhibitions.

Why visit: Established in 1952, this is one of the oldest and one of the most famous art gallery in Mumbai. It has hosted thousands of artists and is central to Mumbai's art history. Good to know: Located in the heart of Kala Ghoda, it is surrounded by cafés and museums. Pavement artists outside make the street just as lively as the gallery itself.

2. Chemould Prescott Road

4. Chatterjee & Lal

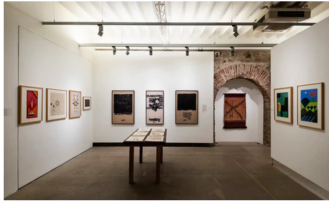

6. Galerie Mirchandani + Steinruecke

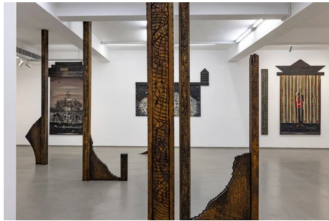

10. Gallery Maskara

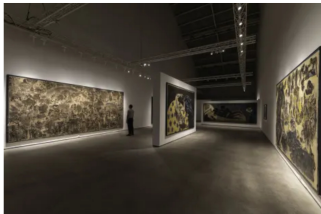

11. Tao Art Gallery



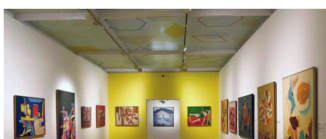

12. Piramal Museum of Art



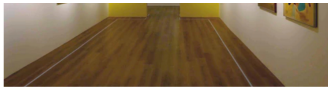

13. Gallery 7

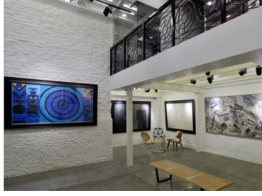

15. Pundole Art Gallery

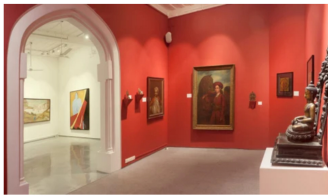

16. Art & Soul

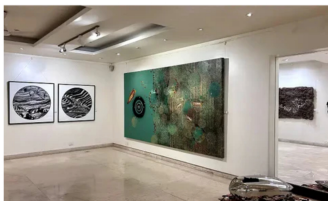
